Fundraising News to Date- Phase II

Phase II of the auditorium restoration, which will include heating and air conditioning, is scheduled to begin this spring, with an estimated cost of \$249,000. Therefore, fundraising is a continuing effort to cover the costs of the project.

The city of Brandon has applied for and been awarded a \$100,000 matching grant from the state of Minnesota. Two additional grants are being sought by the History Center and the City in an effort to match the state grant. Results of those applications won't be known until this spring.

A donation of \$500 for the Auditorium Restoration has been received from the Millerville Fire Department. Many thanks to our sister city fire fighters!

Additional donations are needed and welcome! The chili cook-off is a community effort in the overall fundraising process. The "Grand Old Hall" needs our support! See you there!

L. Winston Johnson was born in Brandon, MN, on November 14, 1918. He was drafted into the Regular Army during World War II on February 14, 1943. After basic training, he volunteered to train with the Air Corps to become a bombardier. His job was to sit in the nose of a B29 Flying Fortress and release the bombs on target.

After receiving his training, the war ended before he was shipped overseas. He was honorably discharged from active duty on December 20,

> On August 6, 1945, the B-29 Enola Gay dropped the first nuclear bomb on the city of Hiroshima, followed three days later by a second bomb dropped by the B-29 Bock's Car on Nagasaki. The Japanese surrendered a week later.

1945. His rank at the time of discharge was Second Lieutenant. He was a member of the Brandon Legion Post.

He returned to Brandon where he and his wife Elda (nee Ostlund) raised their family. He owned and operated the Brandon Lumber Yard until his retirement. He died on May 7, 2007.

Wilbur Hopfner

Wilbur Hopfner was born on May 8, 1914, in
Beaulieu. He joined the United States Army July 15, 1941, and served until November of 1945.
Wilbur served as a medic and was in charge of a hospital surgical ward and operating room. He also cut hair during his time in the medical corps.

Upon his honorable discharge in November of 1945, Wilbur and his wife, Leona (nee Wilken), moved to Brandon where they raised their two children. Wilbur purchased the Barber Shop, which he owned and operated for 50 years, retiring at the age of 80. He was a member of the Brandon Legion Post. Wilbur was a talented saxophone player and played with the Jolly Dutchmen, Don and the Blue Knights, and the Toot N' Gramps.

Wilbur died at the age of 96 on December 13, 2010.

We all remember Fran Fuller, who for most of his life was a resident of Brandon. He was a valued member of the community who volunteered in many ways, including being a member of the Brandon Lions. He was the "go-to person" when microphones and public announcement systems were needed for community events. He and his wife Bernice raised their three children in Brandon.

Fran was an employee of Ottertail Power Company from 1943 until he retired in 1975. One would see him climbing utility poles and doing maintenance on power lines in the Brandon Community.

Fran was a very creative guy as can be seen from the picture at the right. He built a merry-goround for his children on top of a cable spool. Fran is pictured with two of his children, Kevin and Charlie.
