
Probably Shoremaster located in Fergus Falls is the business that most of us remember best about Dennis's business ventures.

From Bavaria to Millerville


George Dobmeyer and his wife, Justine Fidler Dobmeyer, were natives of Bavaria. In preparing to travel to America in 1866, George made the travel chest shown here. George moved to Douglas County in about 1873. The Dobmeyers had nine children.

George owned and operated the Millerville Flour Mill located in Section 13 east of Millerville. George and his father Thomas constructed a dam on the Chippewa River near Lorsung's Lake in 1872–73 to power the mill. After George's death in 1885, his son Ferdinand carried on the business. George was an uncle to Cordelia Dobmeyer, who married Christy Lorsung.

The Dobmeyer chest is on display at the History Center. It was purchased and donated by Norbert Korkowski, Mayor of Millerville.

Veterans' Corner



Frank Winkjer Foslien was born on December 26, 1925, in rural Garfield on the family farm, the son of Frank O. and Julia Foslien.

Frank attended District 54 country school and high school in Brandon. Frank received his high school diploma later on in life because he quit school to fight in World War II. He joined the Navy in 1943 at the age of 17, spending his first eight weeks at Faragat, Idaho. He went on to sonar schooling in California.

Frank was shipped out to the South Pacific where he served on the Patrol Craft Escort 872 until the end of the war. He then returned to the family farm south of Brandon.

Frank was active in his community and his church. He served on the West Moe Lutheran Church council and cemetery board. Frank was the postmaster of Garfield from 1965 through 1988. Frank died on May 31, 2013. He was preceded in death by his first wife, Corrinne, and stepdaughter, Kristi; and he is survived by his wife, Betty, three children, two stepchildren, and many grandchildren and great grandchildren.

Funeral services were held at West Moe Lutheran Church. Military Honors were performed by the Brandon American Legion Post 278 and Veterans of Foreign Wars Post 936.



Leonard Schulte

The items in the memory box shown above belonged to Leonard Schulte, long-time resident of Brandon, and were donated to the History Center by Ellry and Sandy Schulte. Leonard served in the 9th Armored Division, Company C, US Army, during World War II. He saw active duty in the European theater. Among the items are medals, soldier's prayer books, uniform insignia, and several certifications.

Leonard passed away on September 21, 1991.
